The One Small Town Infinity Token White Paper 2026

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1. IMAGINE.

The OST Infinity Token is a digital unit of participation made available exclusively within the One Small Town (OST) member ecosystem. It serves as a symbolic acknowledgement of participation, contribution, unity, and support within a collaborative community framework.

The OST Infinity Token reflects the shared vision of building communities based on harmony, contribution, cooperation, and abundance — a world not imagined only in the distant future, but one actively being built through voluntary participation and collective effort.

Nothing in this opening vision should be interpreted as a promise of financial return, token value, goods, services, or guaranteed community benefits.

2. PREAMBLE

The global socio-economic system has not delivered prosperity, security, and dignity to many communities around the world. Ubuntu Planet NPC, through the One Small Town (“OST”) initiative, recognises these challenges and is committed to developing a constructive, peaceful, and voluntary community model based on cooperation, contribution, and shared responsibility.

OST believes that ordinary people, working together in an organised, transparent, and responsible manner, can pioneer a new pathway that restores purpose, autonomy, dignity, and local resilience for current and future generations.

The One Small Town model proposes a community-centric and inclusive framework rooted in the principle of Contributionism. By encouraging members to voluntarily contribute their time, knowledge, skills, resources, donations, and support toward approved community initiatives, OST aims to assist communities in developing practical projects in areas such as education, energy, health, food security, arts, science, technology, environmental regeneration, and local economic development.

This White Paper outlines the operational, technological, participation, and recognition framework for the OST Infinity Token. The OST Infinity Token is a digital participation and recognition tool designed to support the One Small Town vision within a closed member ecosystem. It is not an investment product, capital-raising instrument, financial product, security, share, debt instrument, currency, or promise of financial return.

Following the transition from a capital-raising approach to a donor-supported participation and recognition model, the OST Infinity Token is intended to function only as a symbolic digital acknowledgement of a member’s participation, contribution, donation, or support. It does not create or confer any ownership rights, equity rights, voting rights, governance rights, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, or entitlement to cash, goods, services, or future value.

Donations made to Ubuntu Planet NPC, One Small Town, or any approved OST initiative are voluntary and non-refundable contributions made to support the mission, administration, technology development, community projects, operational activities, and long-term development of the initiative. Where OST Infinity Tokens are allocated to a donor in recognition of such support, such tokens are issued solely as symbolic acknowledgements of participation and support within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

OST Infinity Tokens are not sold as investments and must not be acquired, donated for, held, transferred, marketed, or promoted with any expectation of profit, liquidity, value appreciation, income, interest,

dividends, repayment, redemption, or financial return. Any member-to-member transfer of OST Infinity Tokens, where permitted by the OST Platform rules, shall occur solely as a private arrangement between registered members on a willing-buyer, willing-seller basis, without any guarantee, underwriting, repurchase obligation, liquidity support, or price support by Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST, the OST Platform, or any associated person or entity.

Through this framework, OST seeks to turn competition into collaboration and to support communities in building practical systems of mutual benefit. The purpose of OST is to help create a world where personal growth, community contribution, local resilience, and shared abundance are pursued through voluntary participation and collective effort.

It all begins with One Small Town.

3. OUR INSPIRATION

Ubuntu is an African philosophy rooted in ancient wisdom and reflected in many cultures across the world. It embodies the principle of unity within community, where each person is encouraged to contribute their unique talents, knowledge, skills, and abilities toward the collective good. As reflected in the well-known principle, “If it is not good for everyone, it is no good at all,” this philosophy forms part of the foundation of the One Small Town community model, which OST refers to as Contributionism.

Contributionism offers a practical and inclusive framework for voluntary community participation. It encourages collaboration, shared purpose, personal responsibility, and mutual upliftment, rather than relying solely on traditional economic structures. Its purpose is not to create an investment scheme, financial return model, capital-raising structure, or profit-driven mechanism, but to support communities in working together to create practical local value through contribution, cooperation, and shared effort.

Ubuntu Planet NPC, a South African-registered non-profit company, exists to help bring this vision into practical reality. Through the One Small Town initiative, Ubuntu Planet NPC supports the development of community-driven ecosystems based on voluntary participation, transparency, contribution, accountability, and mutual support.

Members of One Small Town may contribute their time, knowledge, skills, resources, donations, or support toward approved community projects, businesses, or initiatives. Where applicable, such participation may be recorded through the OST Platform, and the member’s contribution may be acknowledged through the allocation of OST Infinity Tokens. These tokens are symbolic digital acknowledgements of participation, contribution, donation, or support within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

With the transition to a donation-based recognition framework, supporters who are not directly participating in a local project may also choose to support the initiative through voluntary, non-refundable donations. Where OST Infinity Tokens are allocated in recognition of such support, they are issued solely as symbolic acknowledgements of support and participation. They do not create or confer any ownership rights, equity rights, governance rights, voting rights, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, guaranteed benefits, entitlement to goods or services, or expectation of financial return.

Together, OST believes that a more cooperative and community-centred way of living is possible. Through unity, contribution, cooperation, and purpose-driven action, One Small Town aims to support communities where abundance is pursued through collective effort, practical local projects, voluntary participation, and shared responsibility.

4. ONE SMALL TOWN BLUEPRINT

The One Small Town strategy offers a community-driven approach to supporting the renewal of towns, communities, local economies, and social structures through voluntary participation, cooperation, and practical project development.

The model is designed to unite communities around a common purpose: to identify local needs, mobilise local skills, support local initiatives, and encourage members, donors, supporters, businesses, professionals, inventors, farmers, educators, and community leaders to contribute toward practical solutions.

The One Small Town model is not an investment scheme, financial return model, or promise of income, profit, capital growth, economic security, or guaranteed benefit. Instead, it is a participation-based community framework intended to encourage local resilience, shared responsibility, skills development, project support, and community upliftment.

When properly implemented in an active local community, the One Small Town model aims to support the development of practical projects and initiatives that may include food production, education, energy, health and wellness, environmental regeneration, technology, arts, science, local services, and community support structures. The availability, success, scale, and impact of such projects will depend on local leadership, member participation, donor support, available resources, regulatory compliance, project viability, and effective management.

The One Small Town concept has developed over many years through research, planning, community engagement, technology development, and practical implementation work. The vision continues to evolve through the efforts of dedicated contributors, professionals, supporters, strategic partners, ambassadors, and members from different parts of the world.

We are building a future based on contribution, cooperation, transparency, accountability, and community participation — a future we can all be proud of.

4.1 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the One Small Town initiative include the following:

- 4.1.1 Unite people around a simple, constructive, and peaceful community vision.
- 4.1.2 Support the renewal of communities through voluntary participation, practical projects, skills development, and local collaboration.
- 4.1.3 Encourage innovation in farming, food security, seed preservation, and the production of natural and healthy food where possible.
- 4.1.4 Support the establishment of seed banks for heirloom, organic, and locally valuable crops and plants.
- 4.1.5 Encourage the sharing of knowledge by master craftsmen, elders, professionals, skilled workers, educators, and community leaders.

- 4.1.6 Support research, education, and responsible development in the fields of health, wellness, traditional knowledge, and community care, subject to applicable laws and regulations.
 - 4.1.7 Support inventors, researchers, engineers, and technology developers in the development of practical solutions for community benefit.
 - 4.1.8 Support alternative and complementary education models that encourage real skills transfer, mentorship, responsible learning, and healthy educator-student relationships.
 - 4.1.9 Encourage the development of self-supporting energy, water, food, and local service systems where possible and legally compliant.
 - 4.1.10 Make One Small Town communities welcoming to donors, supporters, contributing members, professionals, project partners, and responsible collaborators who wish to support the mission without any expectation of financial return.

5. DEFINITIONS

In this White Paper, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following words and expressions shall have the meanings assigned to them below, and related expressions shall have corresponding meanings.

- 5.1 **“Ambassador”** means an authorised person appointed or recognised by One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, or an approved OST structure to assist with local community development, member onboarding, project coordination, verification, communication, or other approved activities within a specific country, region, town, community, or project area.
- 5.2 **“Agent”** means a person appointed or approved by an ambassador or authorised OST structure to assist with member registration, verification, onboarding, communication, administration, project coordination, or other approved activities within the OST ecosystem.
- 5.3 **“Approved Project”** means a community project, technology project, business activity, upliftment initiative, support programme, store, supplier arrangement, IVC-linked project, or other initiative that has been reviewed and approved by the relevant authorised OST structure for participation, administration, funding support, or platform use.
- 5.4 **“Code of Conduct”** means the rules, standards, ethical principles, and member responsibilities that apply to members, Ambassadors, Agents, project participants, donors, supporters, service providers, and other role players within the OST ecosystem, as amended from time to time. The Code of Conduct may regulate matters such as responsible communication, participation, dispute handling, platform use, member behaviour, confidentiality, and compliance with OST rules.
- 5.5 **“Benefits”** means discretionary and non-guaranteed goods, services, discounts, support items, food baskets, access privileges, community support, or other local benefits that may become available within an active One Small Town initiative from time to time. Community Benefits are

dependent on local project activity, available resources, stock availability, donor support, production capacity, operational viability, proper supervision, contribution records, local governance, and applicable OST rules. Community Benefits do not constitute cash, wages, salary, profit share, dividends, interest, repayment, redemption, investment return, or guaranteed financial benefit.

- 5.6 **“Community Programmes”** means approved participation programmes, community projects, apprentice programmes, upliftment projects, OST businesses, grassroots initiatives, special needs programmes, elderly support programmes, training activities, skills transfer initiatives, or other approved activities in which members may contribute time, knowledge, skills, resources, or support.
- 5.7 **“Compliant Member”** means a registered and verified member who has completed the applicable contribution, participation, verification, or other requirements for a relevant contribution cycle, as recorded or approved through the OST Platform or other approved OST recordkeeping process. Compliant status may be used to determine eligibility for discretionary Community Benefits, where available, but does not create any guaranteed entitlement to cash, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, repayment, redemption, profit, dividends, interest, or financial return.
- 5.8 **“Contribution”** means the voluntary contribution of time, knowledge, skills, effort, resources, services, support, mentorship, administration, project work, training, creative work, community work, or other approved participation by a member toward an approved OST Initiative, Approved Project, Community Programme, or local One Small Town activity.
- 5.9 **“Contribution Session”** means an approved period of contribution, generally based on a three-hour contribution period, completed by a member and verified by the relevant Ambassador, Agent, project supervisor, administrator, OST Platform record, or other approved recordkeeping process.
- 5.10 **“Digital Wallet”** means the OST Platform functionality linked to a registered member’s account, through which OST Infinity Tokens and other approved digital participation records may be displayed, recorded, transferred, or administered within the closed OST member ecosystem. The Digital Wallet is not a bank account, deposit account, investment account, securities account, public crypto wallet, payment account, or guarantee of liquidity, redemption, transferability, cash value, or future value.
- 5.11 **“Donation” or “Support Contribution”** means a voluntary, non-refundable contribution made by a donor, supporter, member, or other participant to support the mission, administration, technology development, community projects, operational activities, or long-term development of One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, or an approved OST Initiative. A Donation or Support Contribution is not an investment, loan, deposit, share purchase, debt instrument, financial product, token purchase, or promise of financial return.
- 5.12 **“Donation Acknowledgement”** means the confirmation, agreement, record, checkbox, platform acceptance, receipt, or other acknowledgement accepted by a donor or supporter confirming that any Donation or Support Contribution is voluntary and non-refundable, is made without expectation of profit, income, interest, dividends, repayment, redemption, liquidity, capital growth, or financial return, and that any OST Infinity Tokens allocated in recognition of such support are symbolic participation acknowledgements only.

- 5.13 **“Effective Date”** means the date on which this White Paper, or any amended version of this White Paper, is published, adopted, accepted, or otherwise made effective by the relevant authorised OST structure, unless another effective date is expressly stated.
- 5.14 **“IVC” or “Inventor Company”** means an inventor, technology owner, research team, project company, special purpose vehicle, or other approved entity or structure that owns, develops, operates, licenses, or participates in a technology, invention, process, project, or commercial opportunity that may be supported, funded, administered, coordinated, or assisted by One Small Town under a separate written agreement.
- 5.15 **“IVC-Linked Project”** means an approved technology or inventor-linked project involving an IVC, which may include projects such as pyrolysis plants, waste management, waste-to-energy, recycling, clean energy, water purification, agriculture, food security, technology development, or other approved initiatives. Any IVC-Linked Project must be governed by separate written agreements dealing with matters such as intellectual property, funding, governance, equipment, compliance, operations, reporting, risk allocation, and project rights.
- 5.16 **“Member” or “OST International Member”** means an individual who has registered on the OST Platform or through an authorised OST process, has accepted the applicable terms and conditions, and has been approved or verified to participate in the One Small Town ecosystem, subject to the applicable membership rules, project rules, platform rules, and verification requirements.
- 5.17 **“Member-to-Member Listing Facility”** or “Closed Member Notice Board” means the closed OST Platform functionality through which verified members may indicate that they wish to transfer OST Infinity Tokens to another verified member within the closed OST member ecosystem. This facility is not a public exchange, crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, broker service, payment service, or guaranteed liquidity facility.
- 5.18 **“Member-to-Member Transfer”** means a private willing-buyer, willing-seller arrangement between verified OST members within the closed OST member ecosystem, where permitted by OST Platform rules. OST does not guarantee a buyer, transfer, price, liquidity, market value, convertibility, redemption, repayment, successful transfer, or future value.
- 5.19 **“Membership Card”** means a physical or digital OST membership card, digital profile, QR code, or other approved identification mechanism that may be issued to verified members who are actively participating in approved OST activities, projects, or initiatives. Membership Cards may be used for identification, participation tracking, contribution verification, platform access, or approved community processes. A Membership Card does not create any entitlement to cash, repayment, redemption, profit, dividends, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, or any guaranteed benefit.
- 5.20 **“One Small Town” or “OST”** means the community-centred initiative, model, vision, system, ecosystem, and related structures described in this White Paper, including its participation model, platform functionality, community projects, approved initiatives, donor-supported framework, and contribution-based approach.
- 5.21 **“One Small Town Area”** means the municipality, town, township, settlement, rural area, community, project area, institution, school, church, farm, factory, traditional community, or other defined area in which an approved OST Initiative or Approved Project is developed, supported, or administered.

- 5.22 **“OST Initiative”** means an approved One Small Town community, project, business activity, local programme, IVC-Linked Project, community support structure, store, participation model, or other activity that members, donors, supporters, Ambassadors, project partners, or participating businesses may support or contribute toward, subject to applicable OST rules and separate project documentation where required.
- 5.23 **“OST Infinity Token”** means a symbolic digital participation token allocated or recorded within the closed OST member ecosystem as an acknowledgement of participation, contribution, donation, or support. OST Infinity Tokens are not securities, shares, debt instruments, financial products, legal tender, public currency, deposit accounts, investment products, or guaranteed stores of value. They do not create ownership rights, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, royalty rights, or entitlement to cash, cryptocurrency, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, liquidity, future value, or financial return.
- 5.24 **“OST Online Store” or “OST Web Store”** means any official electronic store, online marketplace, or web-based store functionality that may be developed or approved by OST in the future, subject to separate terms, availability, lawful payment methods, platform rules, and applicable compliance requirements.
- 5.25 **“OST Physical Store” or “OST Trading Store”** means an approved physical store, warehouse, community outlet, local distribution point, or project location within an active One Small Town initiative where goods, services, support items, food baskets, discounts, or other community benefits may be made available, subject to local project activity, stock availability, operational viability, lawful payment methods, and applicable OST rules.
- 5.26 **“OST Platform”** means the technology and administration platform used to support the One Small Town ecosystem, including registration, verification, member profiles, contribution records, project management, task allocation, Digital Wallet functionality, Membership Cards, donation acknowledgements, symbolic token records, smart contracts or automated recordkeeping, communication tools, reporting, e-commerce or store functionality where approved, closed member-to-member listing functionality, and other approved operational tools. The OST Platform is not a bank, public crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, payment institution, deposit-taking institution, or financial advisory platform.
- 5.27 **“OST Platform Account”** means the account linked to a registered member, donor, supporter, Ambassador, Agent, project participant, service provider, or other approved role player on the OST Platform. The OST Platform Account may hold member information, profile details, contribution records, participation status, Digital Wallet records, token acknowledgements, project records, or other approved platform data. It does not constitute a bank account, investment account, deposit account, securities account, or financial account.
- 5.28 **“SAAS”** means the intellectual property holder of the OST Platform and related technology, software, systems, processes, configurations, and platform functionality, which may make the OST Platform available to Ubuntu Planet NPC, One Small Town NPC, or approved OST structures under applicable licence, service, or platform-use arrangements.
- 5.29 **“OST Terms and Conditions”** means the standard and updated terms, rules, policies, donation terms, platform rules, project rules, privacy policies, Code of Conduct, and any other applicable

documentation governing the use of the OST Platform, membership, donations, token acknowledgements, Digital Wallets, member-to-member transfers, community benefits, and participation in OST Initiatives.

- 5.30 **“Participation Acknowledgement”** means the symbolic recognition of a member’s, donor’s, or supporter’s participation, contribution, donation, or support within the OST ecosystem. Such acknowledgement may include the allocation of OST Infinity Tokens or other approved platform records. A Participation Acknowledgement does not create any guaranteed right to cash, goods, services, repayment, redemption, profit, dividends, interest, income, or financial return.
- 5.31 **“Project”** means an approved initiative, activity, business concept, community programme, technology project, IVC-Linked Project, store, farming project, waste project, energy project, upliftment project, training programme, or other approved endeavour listed, managed, supported, or administered through the OST Platform or authorised OST structures.
- 5.32 **“Role Player”** means any approved user or participant within the OST ecosystem, including a member, donor, supporter, Ambassador, Agent, project manager, supervisor, service provider, IVC, inventor, technology owner, project partner, local business, administrator, or other person or entity approved for a specific role or function within the OST Platform or an OST Initiative.
- 5.33 **“Smart Contract”** means a technology-based rule, automated process, blockchain-like record, digital ledger entry, or platform automation used by the OST Platform to assist with recording, verifying, approving, allocating, transferring, or administering certain platform activities. Smart Contracts are used for administration, recordkeeping, participation tracking, audit trails, and closed-loop ecosystem functionality only. They do not create any investment contract, securities contract, financial product, payment obligation, repayment right, redemption right, profit right, dividend right, interest right, royalty right, or guaranteed financial return.
- 5.34 **“Supporter” or “Donor”** means a person or entity that voluntarily supports One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, or an approved OST Initiative through a Donation, Support Contribution, service, resources, skills, sponsorship, grant, project assistance, or other approved support. A Supporter or Donor does not acquire any ownership rights, profit rights, dividend rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, financial rights, or guaranteed benefits by virtue of such support.
- 5.35 **“Token”** means a symbolic digital record or participation acknowledgement within the OST Platform ecosystem. A Token does not confer ownership, equity, debt, profit participation, dividends, interest, repayment, redemption, financial rights, legal tender status, or guaranteed future value.
- 5.36 **“Token Allocation”** means the recording or allocation of an OST Infinity Token or other approved token within a member’s Digital Wallet or OST Platform Account as a symbolic acknowledgement of completed and verified contribution, participation, donation, support, registration, or other approved activity. Token Allocation is not a wage, salary, cash payment, investment return, repayment, redemption, dividend, interest, or financial distribution.
- 5.37 **“Token Administration Rules”** means the internal principles, platform rules, administrative mechanisms, allocation rules, reserve rules, and recordkeeping processes governing the creation, allocation, suspension, cancellation, recycling, transfer, and administration of OST Infinity Tokens or other approved OST tokens within the closed OST member ecosystem. Tokenomics is designed to support participation, contribution tracking, donor acknowledgement, administration, and

ecosystem functionality, and must not be interpreted as an investor-driven valuation model, price-support mechanism, liquidity mechanism, or speculative profit model.

- 5.38 **“Ubuntu Planet NPC” or “UP”** means Ubuntu Planet NPC, a South African registered non-profit company and approved OST structure involved in supporting the One Small Town initiative, subject to its legal status, governance, agreements, and applicable laws.
- 5.39 **“Use” or “Using”** means accessing, registering for, participating in, interacting with, viewing, transferring, recording, administering, or otherwise using any approved functionality, process, document, platform feature, or participation mechanism within the OST ecosystem, subject to applicable rules, terms, and legal requirements.
- 5.40 **“Verified Member”** means a member whose identity, registration, project link, participation status, or other required information has been reviewed and approved by an authorised Ambassador, Agent, administrator, OST Platform process, or other approved verification method.
- 5.41 **“Vesting”** means the administrative process by which a Token, participation acknowledgement, record, or approved platform entry becomes visible, active, available, or allocated to a member within the OST Platform, subject to applicable rules. Vesting does not create ownership rights, financial rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, profit rights, dividend rights, or guaranteed benefits.
- 5.42 **“Value”** means any reference to value, token value, notional value, participation value, contribution value, or similar wording used in relation to OST Infinity Tokens, member participation, donations, or support within the One Small Town ecosystem. Any such reference is used for symbolic, administrative, explanatory, comparative, or recordkeeping purposes only and must not be interpreted as cash value, market value, redemption value, exchange value, investment value, asset value, or guaranteed future value. Where reference is made to “token value”, such reference is intended only as a non-binding comparison or illustrative explanation of the time, effort, participation, donation, or support acknowledged within the OST ecosystem. It does not represent wages, salary, remuneration, income, profit, dividends, interest, repayment, redemption, financial return, investment return, or any guaranteed financial benefit.
- 5.43 **“Web Application”** means the browser-based, mobile-accessible, or device-accessible software interface through which members, donors, supporters, Ambassadors, Agents, project managers, administrators, or other approved role players may access approved OST Platform functionality.

6. OUR GOAL

The goal of the One Small Town vision is to support communities in building greater resilience, cooperation, local participation, and shared abundance through practical community projects and voluntary contribution.

To achieve this, the One Small Town model encourages a shift toward cooperation and collaboration, where members, donors, supporters, project partners, and local communities work together to identify needs, develop solutions, and support projects that may benefit the wider community.

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Part of the development of One Small Town is to build practical support systems for participating communities. These systems are intended to encourage people to contribute their time, knowledge, skills, resources, and support toward approved initiatives that promote community upliftment, local productivity, education, food security, technology development, environmental regeneration, health and wellness, and other areas of common benefit.

One Small Town recognises that many people face financial pressure and uncertainty. However, the One Small Town model does not promise financial security, income, profit, dividends, capital growth, token value appreciation, repayment, redemption, or any guaranteed financial benefit. The initiative is intended to support community development through participation, contribution, transparency, accountability, and responsible project management.

From time to time, One Small Town may introduce other participation or project-related tokens to support specific approved initiatives, such as seed banks, energy, health and wellness, technology, recycling, or other community projects. Any such tokens will be subject to their own terms, conditions, project rules, compliance requirements, and applicable documentation. No token should be understood as a guarantee of profit, income, repayment, redemption, financial return, or future value.

7. OST INFINITY TOKEN

The OST Infinity Token is called “Infinity” because it reflects the long-term vision of growth, cooperation, contribution, shared abundance, and community development within the One Small Town movement.

The OST Infinity Token is a symbolic digital participation token used within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem. Each OST Infinity Token may be allocated a unique internal reference number on the OST Platform for recordkeeping, tracking, and administration purposes.

Infinity Tokens are intended for closed-loop participation within the One Small Town member ecosystem only. They are not intended for public trading, speculation, investment, external exchange listing, payment outside the OST ecosystem, or use as legal tender.

Infinity Tokens are not backed by cash, property, company assets, revenue, profit, commercial turnover, or any legally enforceable asset. They are symbolic digital records of participation, contribution, donation, or support within the One Small Town ecosystem.

The OST Infinity Token is not a security, share, investment, debt instrument, financial product, currency, or guarantee of any financial return. It does not create ownership rights, voting rights in any company, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, or any entitlement to cash, goods, services, or future value.

This White Paper outlines the details of the OST Infinity Token only. It does not cover the issuing, allocation, use, or treatment of any other token that may be introduced by One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST Platform Technologies, or any related project in the future.

From time to time, One Small Town may introduce other participation tokens, recognition tokens, or project-related tokens to support approved initiatives such as technology, water purification, seed banks, energy, health and wellness, recycling, agriculture, or other community projects. Any such future tokens

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will be subject to their own terms, conditions, project rules, compliance requirements, and applicable documentation. No future token should be understood as a guarantee of profit, income, repayment, redemption, financial return, liquidity, or future value.



7.1 Token Details

Name: OST Infinity Token

Historical start date: 20 August 2022 with a suggested donation acknowledgement amount at launch: USD \$1.00 per OST Infinity Token.

Token was used at launch as an internal OST reference for donation recognition, administrative recording, contribution tracking, supporter acknowledgement, and closed ecosystem participation records only.

Any historical, current, or future reference to a donation acknowledgement amount, internal token reference, or OST internal value is used solely for internal administrative, symbolic, comparative, recordkeeping, and participation acknowledgement purposes within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

Such reference does not represent, and must not be interpreted as, a purchase price, sale price, market value, cash value, redemption value, exchange value, investment price, asset value, guaranteed value, guaranteed benefit, financial return, or promise of future value.

No person should rely on any historical, current, or future donation acknowledgement amount or internal OST value reference as evidence that an OST Infinity Token has or will have any fixed value, resale value, liquidity, redemption right, repayment right, entitlement to benefits, or entitlement to cash, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, income, profit, dividends, interest, or financial return.

8 REGISTRATION PARTICIPATION ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PROCESS

One Small Town Membership Account: To participate in the One Small Town initiative, an individual must register on the OST Platform and elect to join an approved One Small Town initiative, community, project,

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or member ecosystem, subject to the applicable registration requirements, verification process, platform rules, and terms and conditions.

Registration as a member is voluntary. A member's rights, access, participation status, and eligibility for any local community benefits will depend on the member's status, participation, contribution records, applicable project rules, and the availability of benefits within the relevant One Small Town initiative.

Member Members who wish to participate actively in an approved One Small Town initiative, remain in good standing, qualify for compliant status, or receive OST Infinity Tokens as symbolic acknowledgements of participation may be required to contribute time, knowledge, skills, resources, or support toward approved One Small Town projects, community activities, or Contribution Sessions. In active local One Small Town communities, members who wish to remain eligible for token acknowledgements or discretionary local participation benefits, where such benefits are available, may be required to complete a minimum contribution requirement, such as three hours per week or such other requirement as may be determined by the relevant OST initiative.

Any local participation benefits, where available, are discretionary and non-guaranteed. They depend on the rules, resources, project activity, contribution records, management, operational viability, and availability within the relevant local One Small Town initiative.

Registration as a member, participation in an OST initiative, completion of Contribution Sessions, or receipt of OST Infinity Tokens does not guarantee any benefit, income, profit, reward, token value, goods, services, repayment, redemption, liquidity, or financial return.

Donations and Support Contributions: Members, donors, and supporters choose to support One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, or approved OST initiatives through voluntary, non-refundable donations or support contributions.

Any donation or support contribution is made voluntarily and without any expectation of profit, income, interest, dividend, repayment, redemption, liquidity, capital growth, or financial return. Where OST Infinity Tokens are allocated in recognition of a donation or support contribution, they are issued only as symbolic digital acknowledgements of support and participation within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

A donation, recurring donation, or support contribution must not be understood as a token purchase, investment, subscription investment, deposit, loan, share purchase, financial product, or promise of future value. Any recurring donation arrangement, where available, is a voluntary donor-support arrangement and may be subject to separate donation terms and conditions.

Movement Between One Small Town Communities: Where a member moves from One Small Town community to another, continued participation or eligibility for any local community benefits will be subject to registration with the relevant local OST office, ambassador, or approved administrator, and compliance with the participation rules of that local initiative.

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Benefits, projects, contribution requirements, and community arrangements may differ between One Small Town communities. No member is guaranteed the same benefits, goods, services, opportunities, or participation outcomes in every location.

Role Players: A Role Player is a registered user on the OST Platform who has been approved for a specific activity, project, responsibility, or role type within a relevant OST initiative. Role Players may include, among others, members, contributors, ambassadors, project coordinators, supervisors, donors, supporters, service providers, or other approved participants, subject to the role permissions and requirements determined by OST.

Further Terms and Conditions: The details of membership, verification, contributions, donations, token acknowledgements, digital wallet access, platform use, member-to-member transfers, and community benefits are subject to the applicable OST Terms and Conditions, Code of Conduct, project rules, donation terms, platform rules, and any updated guidelines issued by One Small Town or Ubuntu Planet NPC from time to time.

One Small Town may, from time to time, allocate OST Infinity Tokens to new members as a symbolic registration or participation acknowledgement within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

Historically, One Small Town contemplated allocating 100 OST Infinity Tokens to each of the first 200,000 members who joined the One Small Town initiative worldwide, subject to applicable terms and conditions. Any such allocation is intended only as a symbolic digital acknowledgement of registration, participation, and support, and does not represent cash, income, profit, a dividend, interest, repayment, redemption value, investment return, or any guaranteed financial benefit.

Any registration-related token allocation may be subject to activation requirements. For example, tokens may only become active after a member has completed the applicable onboarding process, verification requirements, and first approved Contribution Session in their relevant One Small Town initiative.

One Small Town may amend, suspend, withdraw, limit, or replace any registration acknowledgement programme at any time, subject to the applicable terms and conditions, operational requirements, platform rules, compliance considerations, and availability of the programme.

Registration-related OST Infinity Tokens do not create any entitlement to goods, services, food baskets, discounts, cash, repayment, redemption, profit share, dividend, interest, liquidity, or future value. Their allocation is discretionary and subject to the rules of the OST Platform and the relevant One Small Town initiative.

Members who are technologically disadvantaged, or who do not have easy access to the OST Platform, may be assisted by an authorised OST Ambassador, appointed Agent, or approved administrator in their relevant town or community. Such authorised persons may assist with capturing member details, completing the registration process, supporting onboarding, and helping members understand the relevant participation rules.

All registrations, assisted registrations, token acknowledgements, and contribution records must be properly recorded on the OST Platform or through any other approved OST recordkeeping process.

8 VERIFICATION, CONTRIBUTION SESSIONS AND PARTICIPATION RECORDS

Member verification is an important part of the One Small Town participation process. Verification helps ensure that members are properly registered, linked to the correct One Small Town initiative, and able to participate in approved activities, projects, Contribution Sessions, community activities, or approved structures in accordance with the applicable OST rules.

Only an authorised Local OST Ambassador, approved Agent, project supervisor, administrator, or other authorised OST representative may verify members within a specific One Small Town community, area, project, or initiative. Verification may take place through face-to-face confirmation, platform-based checks, identity confirmation, participation review, project confirmation, Contribution Session records, or any other process determined by OST from time to time.

Members may refer other individuals to join the OST Platform and connect with a specific One Small Town initiative. However, referral alone does not create verified membership status, entitlement to benefits, token rights, financial rights, employment rights, labour rights, or any other participation rights. A referred individual will only become a verified participant once the applicable registration, verification, and onboarding process has been completed and approved by the relevant authorised Ambassador, Agent, administrator, project supervisor, or OST Platform process.

The OST membership and verification process may involve the appointment of Country Ambassadors, Local Ambassadors, Agents, administrators, project supervisors, or other authorised representatives to support member onboarding, local coordination, project development, participation records, contribution verification, and compliance with OST rules.

A registered member will only be regarded as an active verified participant in a specific local One Small Town initiative once the member has completed the applicable onboarding requirements and has been verified through the relevant OST process.

Verification does not guarantee any income, wage, salary, profit, dividend, repayment, redemption, token value, financial return, goods, services, food, meals, food baskets, discounts, community benefits, or any other benefit. Any community support that may become available in a specific One Small Town initiative is discretionary, non-guaranteed, and dependent on local project activity, available resources, willing donations, willing trade, sponsorships, surplus goods, community support, operational viability, proper supervision, local governance, and applicable compliance requirements.

8.1 Contribution Sessions

A three-hour voluntary participation period may be referred to as a Contribution Session.

Members may contribute as many approved three-hour Contribution Sessions as they are willing and able to complete, if there are approved projects, community activities, community-owned OST businesses, tasks, supervision, local coordination, safety requirements, and verification processes available within the relevant One Small Town initiative.

Contribution Sessions are voluntary community participation activities. They are not employment, labour, contract work, paid work, wage work, or services rendered for remuneration unless expressly agreed in a separate written agreement with the relevant authorised party.

Contributions may include time, effort, knowledge, consultation, administration, mentoring, training, project support, technical skills, professional skills, creative work, physical work, community service, care support, communication, coordination, or other approved forms of voluntary participation within the relevant One Small Town initiative.

For every completed and verified three-hour Contribution Session, a member is eligible to be allocated one OST Infinity Token as a symbolic digital acknowledgement of participation, subject to the applicable OST Platform rules, project rules, contribution records, and verification requirements.

OST Infinity Tokens allocated for Contribution Sessions are symbolic participation acknowledgements only. They do not represent wages, salary, remuneration, employment benefits, cash payment, income, profit, dividends, interest, repayment, redemption, token value, or financial return.

8.2 Food, Meals and Local Community Support

Where a local OST community kitchen, project, store, donor programme, participating business, community support structure, or willing contributor has food available, a contributing member may receive a meal, plate, portion of food, or other food support.

Any food, meal, plate, portion, food basket, or food support is made available only on a willing donation, willing trade, sponsorship, surplus distribution, or voluntary community support basis. It must not be interpreted as wages, salary, remuneration, consideration for services, employment benefit, labour benefit, repayment, redemption, or a guaranteed benefit linked to the member's Contribution Session.

The availability of food support is discretionary and non-guaranteed. It depends on local availability, food donations, willing trade arrangements, sponsorships, surplus food, production capacity, community kitchen capacity, stock, operational viability, food safety requirements, local project rules, and applicable laws.

A local OST initiative may set practical daily limits for food support, including a maximum number of meals, plates, portions, or food items per member per day, to ensure fairness, sustainability, stock control, and responsible administration.

No member is guaranteed to receive any food, meal, plate, portion, food basket, goods, services, discount, or community support merely by registering, participating, being verified, completing a Contribution Session, or holding OST Infinity Tokens.

8.3 Tracking and Verification of Contribution Records

Members are expected to ensure that their Contribution Sessions are properly recorded and verified, whether through physical check-in, digital check-in, QR code scanning, supervisor confirmation, platform record, manual record, attendance register, or any other approved method determined by the relevant OST initiative.

Each approved project, community activity, community-owned OST business, or local initiative may have a project manager, supervisor, Ambassador, Agent, or authorised administrator assigned to

coordinate activities, confirm attendance, verify completed participation, and support accurate contribution records.

Contribution records may be maintained on the OST Platform or through another approved OST recordkeeping process. These records may be used for transparency, accountability, project management, participation tracking, symbolic token acknowledgements, local administration, and eligibility assessment for discretionary community support where such support is available.

If a member's contribution cannot be verified, or if there is a dispute regarding attendance, completion, quality, or approval of a Contribution Session, the relevant Ambassador, project manager, supervisor, administrator, or authorised OST structure may review the matter and decide in accordance with the applicable OST rules.

In rural areas or less technologically developed communities, OST may use practical alternatives such as manual records, supervisor approval, local administrator support, attendance registers, or other appropriate methods, if participation records are properly maintained and verified as far as reasonably possible.

8.4 Token Allocation for Verified Contribution Sessions

Upon successful completion and verification of an approved three-hour Contribution Session, a member will receive one OST Infinity Token as a symbolic digital acknowledgement of that completed Contribution Session.

Where a member completes more than one approved and verified Contribution Session, the member may receive the corresponding number of OST Infinity Tokens as symbolic acknowledgements of the completed and verified Contribution Sessions, subject to project availability, proper records, verification, platform rules, and any applicable OST limits or controls.

OST Infinity Tokens allocated for completed Contribution Sessions do not create any ownership rights, holding interest, equity interest, profit rights, royalty rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, employment rights, wage rights, labour rights, or entitlement to any fixed or guaranteed benefit.

8.5 Community Benefits Linked to Participation

Where an active local One Small Town initiative has sufficient goods, services, surplus resources, donor support, willing trade arrangements, stock, production capacity, food support, community kitchen capacity, or other community benefits available, contributing members may become eligible to receive discretionary local community benefits.

Such benefits may include access to available goods, services, meals, food portions, food baskets, discounts, support programmes, or other benefits determined by the relevant local One Small Town initiative from time to time.

The distribution of local community benefits should be determined by the relevant local One Small Town community or authorised local OST structure, provided that such distribution remains aligned with the One Small Town vision, applicable OST rules, proper governance, fair administration, operational viability, available resources, and applicable laws.

Any community benefits are discretionary and non-guaranteed. They depend on local project activity, available resources, willing donations, willing trade, sponsorships, surplus goods, production capacity, operational viability, stock availability, member participation, local governance, platform records, contribution records, and applicable terms and conditions.

No member is guaranteed to receive a meal, plate of food, food basket, goods, cash, income, profit, dividend, financial return, discount, service, product, or any specific benefit merely by registering, participating, being verified, completing Contribution Sessions, or holding OST Infinity Tokens.

Where a local OST Trading Store, community kitchen, approved community outlet, or project distribution point is active and has goods, food, or services available, the relevant local initiative may determine whether one or more OST Infinity Tokens may be used as part of an internal participation record, access mechanism, stock-control mechanism, or closed-loop member process for certain approved community benefits. Such use will be subject to the rules, availability, and operational capacity of that specific local initiative.

Any OST Infinity Token used in connection with a local community benefit may be retained, cancelled, recycled, transferred, recorded, or administered by the relevant OST Trading Store, community kitchen, project, or platform administrator in accordance with applicable OST rules. This process does not create a guaranteed redemption right, fixed exchange value, cash value, wage right, employment right, or entitlement to goods or services.

8.6 No Employment, Wage, Investment, or Guaranteed Return

Contribution Sessions are voluntary community participation activities and do not create an employment relationship, labour relationship, agency relationship, partnership, joint venture, contractor relationship, service-provider relationship, wage obligation, salary obligation, labour benefit, or employment benefit unless expressly agreed in a separate written agreement with the relevant authorised party.

No Contribution Session, token acknowledgement, participation record, meal, food portion, food basket, community activity, local support, or discretionary benefit shall be interpreted as creating any entitlement to wages, salary, remuneration, UIF, PAYE, employee benefits, leave, pension benefits, severance pay, labour claims, employment protection, contractor fees, service fees, or any other employment-related or labour-related right.

The purpose of verification, contribution tracking, and participation records is to support voluntary participation, accurate records, transparency, accountability, project coordination, and proper administration within the One Small Town ecosystem.

Nothing in this clause creates any guaranteed entitlement to cash, repayment, redemption, compensation, profit, dividends, interest, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, community benefits, token value, liquidity, or financial return.

10. PARTICIPATION ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND DISCRETIONARY COMMUNITY BENEFITS

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Membership of the One Small Town initiative is voluntary. Any person may apply to register as a OST member, subject to the applicable OST Platform rules, age requirements, verification requirements, consent requirements, and applicable laws in the relevant country or jurisdiction.

Registration as a member does not, by itself, require the member to complete Contribution Sessions or participate in local OST projects. A person may register as a global member to follow, support, learn about, or connect with the One Small Town initiative.

Members who are under the age of legal majority in their country or jurisdiction may be required to obtain the consent of a parent or legal guardian before using certain OST Platform features, participating in projects, receiving or transferring OST Infinity Tokens, making donations, or entering any member-to-member arrangement.

Only members who meet the applicable minimum age, verification, platform, and legal requirements may participate in any member-to-member transfer, donation-related token acknowledgement, or other token-related platform activity. Where OST permits members from the age of 16 to participate in limited token-related activity, such participation remains subject to applicable laws, parental or guardian consent where required, OST Platform rules, and any additional safeguards determined by OST.

Only members who live in, are connected to, or are approved to participate in a small town, community, suburb, project area, or other location where an OST initiative has been actively launched may participate in local Contribution Sessions, approved projects, community activities, OST Trading Stores, community kitchens, or local OST businesses within that specific community.

Members may also suggest projects, contribute skills, supervise activities, manage approved projects, assist local businesses, or support community initiatives within their OST community ecosystem, subject to local approval, project rules, verification, governance requirements, and applicable laws.

Becoming a member does not guarantee any token allocation, community benefit, goods, services, income, repayment, redemption, liquidity, future value, or financial return.

Becoming a member does not create any employment relationship, partnership, agency relationship, investment relationship, ownership right, profit right, dividend right, repayment right, redemption right, or guarantee of any financial return.

Members may be invited to pledge a minimum of three hours per week, or such other contribution requirement as may be determined by the relevant OST initiative, toward approved OST projects, businesses, community programmes, or other approved activities.

Contributions may include time, effort, knowledge, skills, services, resources, administration, project support, education, mentoring, training, community work, technical support, creative work, professional support, or other forms of participation approved by the relevant OST structure.

Members may also indicate that they are willing to contribute additional time, knowledge, skills, resources, or support toward the upliftment of their One Small Town communities. Where approved projects and activities are available, members may indicate their willingness to participate in additional Contribution Sessions through the OST Platform, or through an authorised Ambassador, Agent, project supervisor, or administrator where platform access is not available.

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The acceptance, allocation, and recognition of additional Contribution Sessions will depend on project availability, local needs, supervisor approval, member suitability, available resources, operational requirements, and the rules of the relevant OST initiative.

Under the standard participation model, one completed and verified Contribution Session will be acknowledged by the allocation of one OST Infinity Token as a symbolic digital acknowledgement of participation.

The number of OST Infinity Tokens that may be allocated to a member in any month will depend on the number of approved and verified three-hour Contribution Sessions completed by that member during that period.

There is no fixed monthly limit on the number of Contribution Sessions a member may complete for token acknowledgement purposes, provided that approved projects, community activities, or OST businesses are available and require member participation.

All Contribution Sessions must be properly recorded and verified in accordance with the applicable OST Platform rules, project rules, supervision requirements, contribution records, and local OST governance processes.

Any OST Infinity Tokens allocated for completed Contribution Sessions remain symbolic digital acknowledgements of participation only and do not represent wages, salary, remuneration, repayment, redemption, token value, or financial return.

The minimum contribution requirement for compliant status under the standard model is one three-hour Contribution Session per week, or four approved Contribution Sessions in a month. However, contribution requirements may differ between local One Small Town initiatives, depending on the needs of the community, available projects, local rules, and approved operating procedures.

Only active and contributing members who meet the applicable participation requirements may become eligible for certain local community benefits, where such benefits are available.

Any such benefits are discretionary, non-guaranteed, and dependent on local project activity, available resources, operational viability, contribution records, platform verification, stock availability, production capacity, donor support, supplier participation, local governance, compliance with OST rules, and the terms of the relevant One Small Town initiative.

OST Infinity Tokens will be allocated to members as symbolic digital acknowledgements of approved participation, contribution, donation, or support within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

OST Infinity Tokens are symbolic participation acknowledgements only. They do not represent wages, salary, employment benefits, cash payments, profit share, dividends, interest, repayment rights, redemption rights, investment returns, or any guaranteed financial benefit.

An OST Infinity Token does not represent a holding interest, ownership interest, equity interest, share, debt claim, investment right, royalty right, profit right, dividend right, interest right, repayment right, redemption right, or entitlement to any fixed or guaranteed benefit.

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Where an active local One Small Town initiative has available goods, services, resources, donor support, production capacity, stock, or approved community benefits, compliant members may become eligible to receive certain discretionary community benefits.

Discretionary community benefits may include food baskets, goods, services, discounts, support items, access to local community programmes, project-related benefits, or other local benefits determined by the relevant One Small Town initiative from time to time.

Food, goods, services, discounts, support items, or other community benefits may only be made available where an approved local One Small Town project, OST Trading Store, community outlet, supplier, donor, or participating business is active, operational, properly managed, and has sufficient goods, services, stock, resources, or benefits available.

A compliant member may become eligible to receive certain discretionary community benefits at the end of a relevant contribution cycle, provided that the member has completed the applicable contribution requirements, has been properly verified, and the relevant local One Small Town initiative has available benefits to distribute.

Members who do not complete the applicable contribution requirements for a relevant contribution cycle may be recorded as non-compliant for that period and may not be eligible for discretionary community benefits linked to that period.

The allocation of any food basket, goods, services, discount, support item, or other community benefit must be based on local availability, fair administration, proper recordkeeping, local project rules, operational viability, and the rules of the relevant One Small Town initiative.

Any calculation, allocation, recordkeeping, or distribution of participation acknowledgements and discretionary community benefits will be managed through the OST Platform, blockchain-like recordkeeping systems, manual records, supervisor approvals, or other approved administrative processes.

Until such time as a local OST initiative has goods, services, or community benefits available, members may continue to receive OST Infinity Tokens as symbolic digital acknowledgements of completed and verified Contribution Sessions, subject to applicable OST rules.

OST Infinity Tokens may, where approved by the relevant local initiative, be used as part of an internal participation record, access mechanism, or closed-loop member process for certain discretionary community benefits. However, OST Infinity Tokens do not have a fixed cash value, guaranteed exchange value, guaranteed redemption value, or guaranteed entitlement to goods or services.

No fixed percentage, formula, royalty split, profit allocation, holding interest, investor percentage, office percentage, or financial distribution is created by this White Paper. Any previous references to royalty profit share, holding interest benefits, investor percentages, office percentages, or profit-sharing arrangements should not be interpreted as creating any enforceable right to profits, dividends, income, cash, repayment, redemption, or financial return.

Historically, certain OST Infinity Tokens were allocated in recognition of supporter contributions made to assist with the development of the One Small Town initiative, including administration, technology

development, operational support, and selected community activities. Under the current donation-based recognition model, any such supporter contribution is treated as a voluntary, non-refundable donation and not as an investment, token sale, public offering, share purchase, debt instrument, or financial product.

Any OST Infinity Tokens allocated in recognition of donations or support contributions are symbolic acknowledgements only and do not create any entitlement to repayment, redemption, profit participation, dividends, interest, liquidity, future value, or financial return.

Any future commercial, project, supplier, licence, donation, technology, store, or operational arrangement involving local OST businesses, project partners, donors, supporters, offices, community structures, or participating businesses must be recorded in separate written agreements approved by the relevant authorised OST structure and must comply with applicable laws and regulations.

No member, donor, supporter, or token holder is guaranteed to receive cash, income, profit, dividend, royalty, interest, repayment, redemption, food basket, goods, services, discounts, support items, token value, liquidity, future value, or any other benefit merely by registering, donating, contributing time, remaining compliant, holding OST Infinity Tokens, or participating in a One Small Town initiative.

All participation acknowledgements and discretionary community benefits remain subject to availability, local project rules, operational viability, proper governance, applicable OST rules, platform records, and applicable compliance requirements.

11. THE OST TRADING STORE

The OST Trading Store is intended to become a local community retail, distribution, support, and participation hub within an active One Small Town initiative. Where established, an OST Trading Store may offer goods, services, products, produce, crafts, technologies, support items, or other items that are grown, manufactured, acquired, supplied, donated, or created by OST members, local producers, community projects, participating businesses, donors, suppliers, or approved project partners.

The long-term vision of the OST Trading Store is to support local production, local trade, food security, community resilience, member participation, and access to useful goods and services within the One Small Town ecosystem.

Each OST Trading Store may develop according to the needs, resources, production capacity, suppliers, regulatory requirements, premises, licensing requirements, management capacity, operational viability, and community readiness of the relevant local One Small Town initiative.

Any physical or online store activity will be subject to applicable consumer protection, tax, licensing, food safety, product safety, health, municipal, import/export, environmental, labour, data protection, payment, and other relevant laws and regulations.

The establishment, timing, location, scale, and operation of any OST Trading Store cannot be guaranteed. Each store will depend on local leadership, project readiness, community participation, donor support, supply chain development, funding, premises, licences, regulatory approvals, management capacity, and sustainable operations.

The OST Trading Store model is therefore intended to grow progressively as local One Small Town communities become active, organised, productive, compliant, and properly managed.

11.1 Store Functions. An OST Trading Store may, where available and operational, serve several possible functions, including:

- 11.1.1 Providing a local outlet for goods and services produced or supplied through approved OST projects.
- 11.1.2 Trading of goods and services among OST members, within the OST ecosystem.
 - 11.1.2.1 Supporting voluntary member-to-member exchange, trade, and access to goods and services within the closed OST member ecosystem, where approved by the relevant local OST initiative.
 - 11.1.2.2 Members may, where permitted by the relevant local OST Trading Store rules, offer unwanted goods, surplus goods, produced goods, handmade items, services, skills, or other approved contributions to the OST Trading Store or to other members within the closed OST ecosystem.
 - 11.1.2.3 Where approved, OST Infinity Tokens may be used as an internal participation record, exchange reference, or symbolic acknowledgement linked to such voluntary member-to-member exchange or local store process.
 - 11.1.2.4 Any such exchange must remain a private willing-provider, willing-receiver arrangement between participating members or the relevant local OST Trading Store, subject to availability, local rules, stock control, quality checks, consumer protection requirements, food safety requirements, product safety requirements, and applicable laws.
 - 11.1.2.5 OST Infinity Tokens used in this process do not represent cash, legal tender, wages, repayment, redemption value, guaranteed exchange value, investment value, or entitlement to goods or services. The availability of any goods, services, exchange, trade, or store benefit remains discretionary, non-guaranteed, and dependent on local participation, stock, community rules, and operational viability.
- 11.1.3 Supporting local farmers, producers, manufacturers, artisans, inventors, service providers, and community businesses.
- 11.1.4 Assisting with the distribution of surplus goods, donated goods, food baskets, support items, or other community benefits where such benefits are available.
- 11.1.5 Providing a physical access point for members who require assistance with registration, membership cards, digital wallets, contribution records, project participation, or platform support.
- 11.1.6 Supporting local community development by encouraging practical trade, skills development, local supply chains, local production, and community participation.
- 11.1.7 Providing a future channel through which approved OST goods, services, and community benefits may be made available to members and, where appropriate, to the broader public.

Where a local OST Trading Store is active and has goods or services available, compliant members may become eligible to access certain discretionary community benefits, which may include food baskets, goods, services, discounts, support items, or other local benefits determined by the relevant One Small Town initiative from time to time.

Any such benefits are discretionary, non-guaranteed, and dependent on local project activity, stock availability, production capacity, available resources, donations, supplier participation, operational viability, contribution records, local governance, and applicable OST rules.

No member is guaranteed to receive a monthly basket of goods, discount, product, service, cash payment, income, dividend, profit share, repayment, redemption, or financial return merely by being a member, holding OST Infinity Tokens, donating, or participating in a One Small Town initiative.

Where a basket of goods or other community benefit becomes available, the composition, value, quantity, frequency, and availability of such benefit may differ between communities and may change from time to time. Benefits may depend on what is produced, grown, donated, manufactured, acquired, or supplied within that local One Small Town initiative.

- 11.2 Use of Tokens in an OST Trading Store.** The OST Trading Store, approved community outlet, or local project distribution point is active and operational, Membership Cards or approved digital member profiles may be used to identify members, verify participation status, record transactions, and support access to approved community benefits.

OST Infinity Tokens may, where approved by the relevant local One Small Town initiative, be used as part of an internal participation record, access mechanism, or closed-loop member process connected to certain discretionary community benefits.

Where a compliant member receives a discretionary community benefit, such as a food basket, goods, services, discount, support item, or other approved local benefit, the relevant local OST initiative may require one or more OST Infinity Tokens to be recorded, transferred, retained, cancelled, recycled, or administered through the OST Trading Store or OST Platform as evidence that the relevant benefit has been accessed or collected.

This process is intended for internal recordkeeping, accountability, stock control, contribution tracking, benefit tracking, and participation administration. It does not create a fixed cash value, guaranteed exchange value, guaranteed redemption value, or guaranteed entitlement to any food basket, goods, services, discount, or community benefit.

OST Infinity Tokens are not legal tender, are not redeemable for cash, and do not represent a guaranteed right to goods, services, discounts, repayment, redemption, income, profit, dividends, interest, token value, liquidity, or financial return.

The availability, nature, quantity, value, and frequency of any food basket, goods, services, discount, support item, or community benefit will depend on local project activity, available stock, production capacity, donated goods, supplier participation, operational viability, community needs, local governance, and applicable OST rules.

11.3 Purchasing from OST Trading Store / Warehouse. (Not Online Store)

This section applies to physical OST Trading Stores, warehouses, community outlets, or approved local distribution points only. The process for purchasing from an OST online store or web store will be made available separately if an OST online store becomes operational.

Only registered OST members with a valid OST Membership Card, digital member profile, or other approved OST member identification may shop at an OST Trading Store. A person who is not yet a member may, where permitted by the relevant OST Trading Store and subject to applicable

registration, verification, platform, and local store rules, apply to register as an OST member before shopping at the OST Trading Store.

The OST Trading Store may operate on a member-access basis, like a membership store model, where persons first register as members and receive an approved membership card or member profile before being allowed to purchase or access goods and services.

Goods and services in an OST Trading Store should, where applicable, be priced or referenced in the applicable local currency so that members can clearly understand the price, compare value, and make informed purchasing decisions.

Purchases at an OST Trading Store may be made using accepted lawful payment methods, including the applicable local fiat currency, approved store vouchers, approved membership card functionality, or any other lawful and compliant payment or access method introduced by the relevant OST Trading Store from time to time.

Where approved by the relevant OST Trading Store, a member may receive OST Trading Store vouchers, credits, or access records linked to a donation, support contribution, willing trade, return of approved goods, or other approved store process. Any such vouchers, credits, or access records will be subject to the applicable store rules, availability, compliance requirements, and local laws.

Compliant members may, where approved by the relevant OST Trading Store and subject to availability, qualify for discretionary discounts, access privileges, member pricing, or other local community benefits. Any such discounts, access privileges, or benefits are discretionary, non-guaranteed, and may be amended, suspended, or withdrawn in accordance with local OST rules and operational requirements.

11.4 Income generated by an OST Trading Store, where applicable, may be used for approved local purposes, which include:

- 11.4.1 Store management, maintenance, upgrades, equipment, stock control, systems, and operating expenses.
- 11.4.2 Fair remuneration of approved staff, managers, service providers, or contributors where applicable and lawfully structured.
- 11.4.3 One Small Town local office administration and operational expenses.
- 11.4.4 Support for approved community projects, upliftment programmes, local development activities, or neglected community needs.
- 11.4.5 Other approved uses determined by the relevant local OST governance structure, subject to proper records, transparency, accountability, and applicable laws.
- 11.4.6 All physical store, warehouse, distribution, food, agricultural, health, product, technology, voucher, payment, and service-related activities must comply with applicable consumer protection, tax, licensing, food safety, product safety, health, municipal, import/export, environmental, labour, payment, data protection, and other relevant laws and regulations.

11.5 Important Notice.

- 11.5.1 The OST Infinity Tokens are not held in traditional public crypto wallets. They are managed within the OST Platform Digital Wallet as symbolic digital records of participation, contribution, donation, or support within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

- 11.5.2 The OST Infinity Tokens are not backed by cash, property, company assets, revenue, profit, commercial turnover, sweat equity, labour, store stock, vouchers, or any legally enforceable asset. They do not create any ownership rights, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, or entitlement to goods, services, cash, cryptocurrency, store vouchers, discounts, or future value.
- 11.5.3 The OST Infinity Tokens are not legal tender, are not public currency, are not redeemable for cash, and are not intended for public trading, speculation, investment, external exchange listing, or payment outside the OST ecosystem.
- 11.5.4 One Small Town does not accept cryptocurrency as payment unless and until a lawful, approved, and compliant payment method is formally introduced and communicated through official OST channels.
- 11.5.5 To manage, view, transfer, or otherwise interact with OST Infinity Tokens, a person must be a registered and verified member of the OST Platform and must have access to an approved OST Digital Wallet, Membership Card, or other authorised OST account functionality, as applicable.
- 11.5.6 Nothing in this OST Trading Store clause creates any guarantee that an OST Trading Store, warehouse, online store, food basket, goods, services, discount, voucher, support item, or community benefit will be available in any specific country, town, community, project, or timeframe.

12. OST MEMBERSHIP CARDS

OST Membership Cards will be allocated to verified members who are actively contributing toward approved OST activities, projects, or initiatives.

Membership Cards will only be made available through authorised OST Ambassadors, appointed Agents, or approved administrators linked to active and approved One Small Town projects or initiatives. A member will not automatically receive a Membership Card merely by registering on the OST Platform or holding OST Infinity Tokens.

Members with smartphones may have the option to access a digital membership card or member profile through their device, where such functionality is available on the OST Platform. Physical cards may be issued where required and where operationally practical.

Each Membership Card, whether physical or digital, may carry a unique QR code linked to the member's OST Platform account, contribution records, membership status, and digital wallet functionality, where applicable.

Contributing members may be required to collect their physical Membership Card at a designated location within their active One Small Town community. During this process, the authorised Ambassador, Agent, or administrator may verify the member's identity, participation status, approved project involvement, and contribution record.

Membership Cards are intended to support member identification, participation tracking, contribution verification, access to approved activities, and administration within the OST ecosystem. A Membership Card does not create any entitlement to cash, repayment, redemption, profit share, dividend, interest, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, or any guaranteed community benefit.

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The issue, activation, suspension, replacement, or cancellation of Membership Cards will be subject to OST Platform rules, local project rules, verification requirements, and the discretion of the relevant authorised OST structure.

The Membership Card may be used as a means of identification at approved OST retail stores, OST Trading Stores, project locations, or designated community participation points, where such facilities are active and operational.

A suitable verification and access mechanism may be developed and implemented for this purpose before or as the first OST Trading Stores and approved community outlets become operational.

OST Trading Stores, food baskets, goods, services, discounts, or community benefits may only become available where a local One Small Town project is active, operational, properly supervised, and has sufficient goods, services, stock, resources, or approved benefits available.

There is no guarantee that any OST Trading Store, food basket, goods, service, discount, or community benefit will be available in any specific country, town, community, project, or timeframe.

Membership Cards may be made available from designated OST collection points, authorised Ambassadors, appointed Agents, or approved administrators linked to active and approved OST projects or initiatives.

Members may receive electronic communication regarding the availability, collection process, activation, and use of their Membership Cards, where applicable.

13. CONTINGENCIES

13.1 If a Member Cannot Attend a Pledged Contribution Session. The OST Platform may provide a function through which members can indicate that they are unable to attend a pledged Contribution Session at the scheduled time.

Where possible, members should notify the relevant Ambassador, project manager, supervisor, local manager, or authorised administrator at least 48 hours before the scheduled Contribution Session, so that the project team may attempt to find a suitable replacement or make alternative arrangements.

Members will not be required to disclose private or sensitive personal reasons unless such disclosure is necessary for practical project planning, safety, accommodation, or compliance purposes.

Members who do not have access to a smartphone, computer, or the OST Platform may contact their local manager, Ambassador, Agent, or authorised administrator through the approved communication channels. The authorised person may assist the member by recording the relevant information on the OST Platform or through another approved OST recordkeeping process.

Where a member misses a pledged Contribution Session, the member may be required to make up the missed contribution within the same contribution cycle, where reasonably possible, to maintain compliant status for that period. The ability to make up missed contribution time will depend on project availability, local rules, supervisor approval, and practical operational requirements.

- 13.2 **Member Compliance.** Members are encouraged to uphold their contribution pledge and, where applicable, complete the minimum required Contribution Sessions for the relevant month or contribution cycle.

Under the standard model, a member may be required to complete four three-hour Contribution Sessions in a month to remain compliant for that period. However, the specific contribution requirements may differ between One Small Town initiatives, depending on local project rules, available activities, community needs, and approved operating procedures.

Compliant status is used for participation tracking, project management, platform records, token acknowledgements, and possible eligibility for discretionary community benefits where such benefits are available.

Compliant status does not create any guaranteed entitlement to cash, income, profit, dividends, interest, repayment, redemption, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, or financial return.

- 13.3 **Suspension or Non-Availability of Community Benefits.** If a member does not complete the minimum required Contribution Sessions for a relevant contribution cycle, the member may not be regarded as compliant for that period and may not be eligible for any discretionary community benefits linked to that period.

Any community benefits, including food baskets, goods, services, discounts, support items, or other local benefits, are discretionary, non-guaranteed, and dependent on local project activity, available resources, production capacity, stock availability, donations, operational viability, local governance, contribution records, and applicable OST rules.

OST Infinity Tokens already allocated to a member for completed and verified Contribution Sessions will remain recorded in the member's Digital Wallet, subject to the OST Platform rules and any applicable compliance requirements.

Where permitted by the OST Platform rules, members will be able to transfer OST Infinity Tokens to other registered members through a private willing-buyer, willing-seller arrangement or other approved closed-loop member-to-member process. Any such transfer is private between the participating members and is not guaranteed, underwritten, priced, redeemed, or facilitated as a financial return by OST.

- 13.4 **If a Member Is Sick or Temporarily Unable to Contribute.** If a member is sick, recovering, hospitalised, temporarily unavailable, or otherwise unable to complete a pledged Contribution Session, the member should notify the relevant local manager, Ambassador, Agent, project supervisor, or authorised administrator as soon as reasonably possible.

The member may be asked to indicate the expected period of absence where this is practical and appropriate. OST will respect the member's privacy and will not require unnecessary disclosure of sensitive personal or medical information.

Where possible, members may make up missed Contribution Sessions after recovery or when they are able to participate again, subject to available projects, local rules, supervisor approval, and practical operational requirements.

It is important to recognise that contribution can take many forms. Not all contributions require physical labour or strenuous activity. Where appropriate, members may contribute through alternative tasks such as administration, design, accounting support, writing, sewing, knitting, public relations, social media support, project management, business planning, mentoring, training, communication, coordination, or other suitable activities approved by the relevant OST structure.

- 13.5 Members Unable to Contribute for a Prolonged Period.** If a member is unable to contribute for a prolonged period due to medical, personal, disability-related, age-related, family, or other serious circumstances, the member should inform the relevant local manager, Ambassador, Agent, or authorised administrator of the type of contribution they may still be able to perform, where possible.

The relevant OST initiative may attempt to identify suitable roles or adjusted contribution opportunities that accommodate the member's circumstances, skills, abilities, and limitations.

Where a member is unable to perform normal Contribution Sessions, the relevant OST structure may approve adapted, reduced, alternative, remote, administrative, advisory, creative, supportive, or community-based contribution activities.

In exceptional cases, where a member is unable to contribute due to serious circumstances, the local One Small Town governance structure may determine whether the member should be treated as compliant, conditionally compliant, exempt, or specially accommodated for a defined period. Such decisions should be made fairly, transparently, and in accordance with the applicable local rules and OST guidelines.

- 13.6 Special Needs, Disability, Care, and Inclusion.** One Small Town aims to be inclusive and supportive of members with special needs, disabilities, health limitations, age-related limitations, or other circumstances that may affect their ability to participate in standard Contribution Sessions.

Where possible, OST initiatives should create suitable and meaningful activities that allow such members to contribute within the range of their abilities, while maintaining dignity, inclusion, stimulation, participation, and community connection.

These activities may include creative work, mentoring, storytelling, education, administration, crafts, light production, care support, communication, skills transfer, cultural knowledge sharing, or other appropriate tasks.

The purpose is to ensure that every member who wishes to participate has an opportunity to do so in a manner that is practical, respectful, safe, and suitable to their circumstances.

- 13.7 **Elderly Members and Retirement Communities.** Elderly members and members living in old age homes, retirement villages, care homes, or similar environments may contribute valuable knowledge, wisdom, skills, experience, cultural memory, mentorship, and practical support to their communities.

One Small Town initiatives may develop appropriate activities and projects in which elderly members can participate meaningfully, safely, and enjoyably. These activities may include mentoring, storytelling, education, crafts, administration, food preparation, care support, gardening, cultural preservation, community advice, or other suitable contributions.

Where local resources and community structures allow, elderly members may also receive support and care through approved community support projects. Any such support will be subject to availability, local resources, project viability, and applicable rules.

- 13.8 **The One Small Town model is based on active voluntary participation.** Only members who are actively participating, contributing, and properly recorded as compliant within their relevant One Small Town community may be eligible for discretionary community benefits, where such benefits are available.

A member who is not actively contributing, or who is not recorded as compliant for a relevant period, will not be eligible for discretionary community benefits linked to that period. However, non-participation or non-compliant status does not automatically result in suspension, deregistration, or removal from the OST Platform.

Members may remain registered on the OST Platform indefinitely, subject to the applicable OST Terms and Conditions, platform rules, compliance requirements, and lawful use of the platform. Their eligibility for any discretionary community benefits will only apply if they are active, verified, contributing, and compliant within their relevant One Small Town community.

Where a member does not meet the applicable contribution requirements, the OST Platform or authorised local administrator may record the member as inactive, non-contributing, or non-compliant for the relevant period. Such status is used for participation tracking, contribution records, platform administration, and benefit eligibility only. It does not create any claim for cash, repayment, redemption, compensation, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, or financial return.

A member may voluntarily request cancellation of membership or may choose to stop participating at any time, subject to the applicable OST Terms and Conditions and platform rules.

OST may suspend, restrict, or terminate a member's access only where reasonably required for breach of OST rules, fraud prevention, AML/KYC controls, sanctions screening, platform integrity, security, legal compliance, misconduct, dispute management, incorrect records, or protection of the OST ecosystem.

Any membership status change, inactive status, non-compliant status, suspension, restriction, cancellation, termination, or reinstatement should be recorded through the OST Platform or any other approved OST recordkeeping process.

Nothing in this clause creates any guaranteed entitlement to community benefits, employment, cash, repayment, redemption, compensation, profit share, dividends, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, token value, liquidity, or financial return.

14. DIGITAL WALLET

Every verified member will be provided with access to a Digital Wallet linked to their OST Platform account, where such functionality is available and the member has completed the applicable registration, verification, and onboarding requirements.

The Digital Wallet may be accessed through a mobile device, computer, or other approved platform interface, subject to system availability, security requirements, member verification, and the applicable OST Platform rules.

The Digital Wallet is intended to display and manage OST Infinity Tokens and other approved digital participation records within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem. It is used for internal recordkeeping, participation tracking, token acknowledgements, and approved closed-loop member functionality.

The Digital Wallet is not a bank account, deposit account, investment account, securities account, public crypto wallet, payment account, or guarantee of liquidity, redemption, transferability, cash value, or future value.

Where permitted by the OST Platform rules, members may use the Digital Wallet to transfer OST Infinity Tokens to other verified members within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem. Any such transfer must comply with the applicable OST rules, platform controls, verification requirements, and applicable laws.

The OST Platform may also provide a closed member-to-member listing facility or notice board through which verified members may indicate that they wish to transfer OST Infinity Tokens to another verified member. This facility is not a public exchange, crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, or guaranteed liquidity facility.

Any member-to-member transfer of OST Infinity Tokens is a private willing-buyer, willing-seller arrangement between the participating registered members. One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST Platform Technologies, and their related parties do not guarantee a buyer, do not guarantee a transfer, do not set or guarantee any price, do not redeem OST Infinity Tokens, and do not guarantee liquidity, market value, convertibility, cash value, goods, services, or future value.

Members may, where permitted by applicable laws and OST Platform rules, use OST Infinity Tokens within approved closed-loop community processes, approved member interactions, or approved local OST initiatives. Such use is subject to local project rules, availability, compliance requirements, and the consent of the participating members or approved project.

OST Infinity Tokens are not legal tender and are not intended for use as public currency, public payment instruments, external exchange assets, speculative assets, or general-purpose payment instruments outside the One Small Town member ecosystem.

Members are responsible for keeping their Digital Wallet access details secure and must immediately report any suspected unauthorised access, error, loss, or suspicious activity to the relevant OST support channel.

Digital Wallet: After registration and successful verification, a member may be provided with access to a digital wallet linked to their OST Platform account. The digital wallet is used to display and manage OST Infinity Tokens and other approved digital participation records within the OST Platform ecosystem.

The digital wallet does not constitute a bank account, deposit account, investment account, securities account, public crypto wallet, or guarantee of liquidity, redemption, transferability, or cash value. It is a platform tool used for internal recordkeeping, member participation, and approved closed-loop ecosystem functionality.

Members must only participate in any member-to-member transfer in accordance with the OST Platform rules, applicable laws, and any verification or compliance requirements that may apply.

15. ALLOCATION AND MEMBER-TO-MEMBER TRANSFER OF TOKENS

OST Infinity Tokens are recorded and managed on the OST Platform and related internal recordkeeping systems. They are used as symbolic digital acknowledgements of participation, contribution, donation, or support within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem.

OST Infinity Tokens are not legal tender, public currency, securities, shares, debt instruments, investment products, financial products, or guaranteed stores of value. They do not create ownership rights, profit rights, dividend rights, interest rights, repayment rights, redemption rights, or any entitlement to cash, cryptocurrency, goods, services, or future value.

OST Infinity Tokens are not backed by cash, property, company assets, revenue, profit, commercial turnover, or any legally enforceable asset. They are symbolic digital records used within the OST Platform ecosystem.

All OST Infinity Tokens are reflected in the member's OST Digital Wallet, subject to the applicable registration, verification, platform rules, and compliance requirements.

Where permitted by the OST Platform rules, members may transfer OST Infinity Tokens to other verified members within the closed One Small Town member ecosystem. Any such transfer is a private willing-buyer, willing-seller, arrangement between the participating members.

The OST Platform may provide a closed member-to-member listing facility or notice board where verified members may indicate that they wish to transfer OST Infinity Tokens to another verified member. This facility is not a public exchange, crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, or guaranteed liquidity facility.

One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST Platform Technologies, and their related parties do not guarantee that a buyer will be available, do not guarantee that a transfer will occur, do not set or guarantee any price, do not provide investment advice, do not redeem OST Infinity Tokens, and do not guarantee liquidity, market value, convertibility into cash, redemption value, or future value.

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Historically, Ubuntu Planet NPC and One Small Town accepted supporter contributions to fund the development of the One Small Town initiative. These contributions assisted with matters such as administration, legal fees, professional fees, management tools, technology development, travel, accommodation, operating costs, platform development, and selected community project preparation.

Under the current donation-based recognition model, such supporter contributions are treated as voluntary, non-refundable donations or support contributions. Any OST Infinity Tokens allocated in recognition of such support are symbolic acknowledgements only and do not represent any form of cryptocurrency sale, token sale, public offering, investment, share purchase, debt instrument, deposit, loan, financial product, or promise of financial return.

Historically, a portion of OST Infinity Tokens was allocated for supporter recognition in connection with donations and support contributions made toward the development of the One Small Town initiative. Going forward, any allocation of OST Infinity Tokens in recognition of donor support will be subject to the applicable donation terms, platform rules, availability, and compliance requirements.

Any historical suggested donation acknowledgement amount, including the initial USD \$1.00 per OST Infinity Token reference, was used for internal recognition and contribution tracking purposes only. It did not represent a guaranteed market value, redemption value, investment price, asset value, or promise of future value.

One Small Town does not determine, guarantee, publish, or maintain a fixed cash value for OST Infinity Tokens. Any value attributed to an OST Infinity Token in a private member-to-member transfer is determined solely by the participating members at their own discretion and risk.

OST does not guarantee demand, liquidity, resale value, future value, price appreciation, successful transfer, or convertibility into cash, cryptocurrency, goods, or services.

OST Infinity Tokens may be allocated to members who complete approved and verified Contribution Sessions. Under the standard model, one completed and verified three-hour Contribution Session may be acknowledged by the allocation of one OST Infinity Token, subject to the applicable OST rules and any maximum allocation limits.

OST Infinity Tokens may also be allocated as symbolic acknowledgements of voluntary donations, support contributions, registration participation, or other approved forms of support, subject to the applicable terms and conditions.

The OST member-to-member listing facility is available only to registered and verified OST members with approved OST Platform accounts and Digital Wallets. It is not open to the public.

The OST member-to-member listing facility is not a public exchange, crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, broker service, payment service, or guaranteed liquidity facility. The OST Platform does not operate as a crypto exchange and does not provide investment, financial, legal, or tax advice.

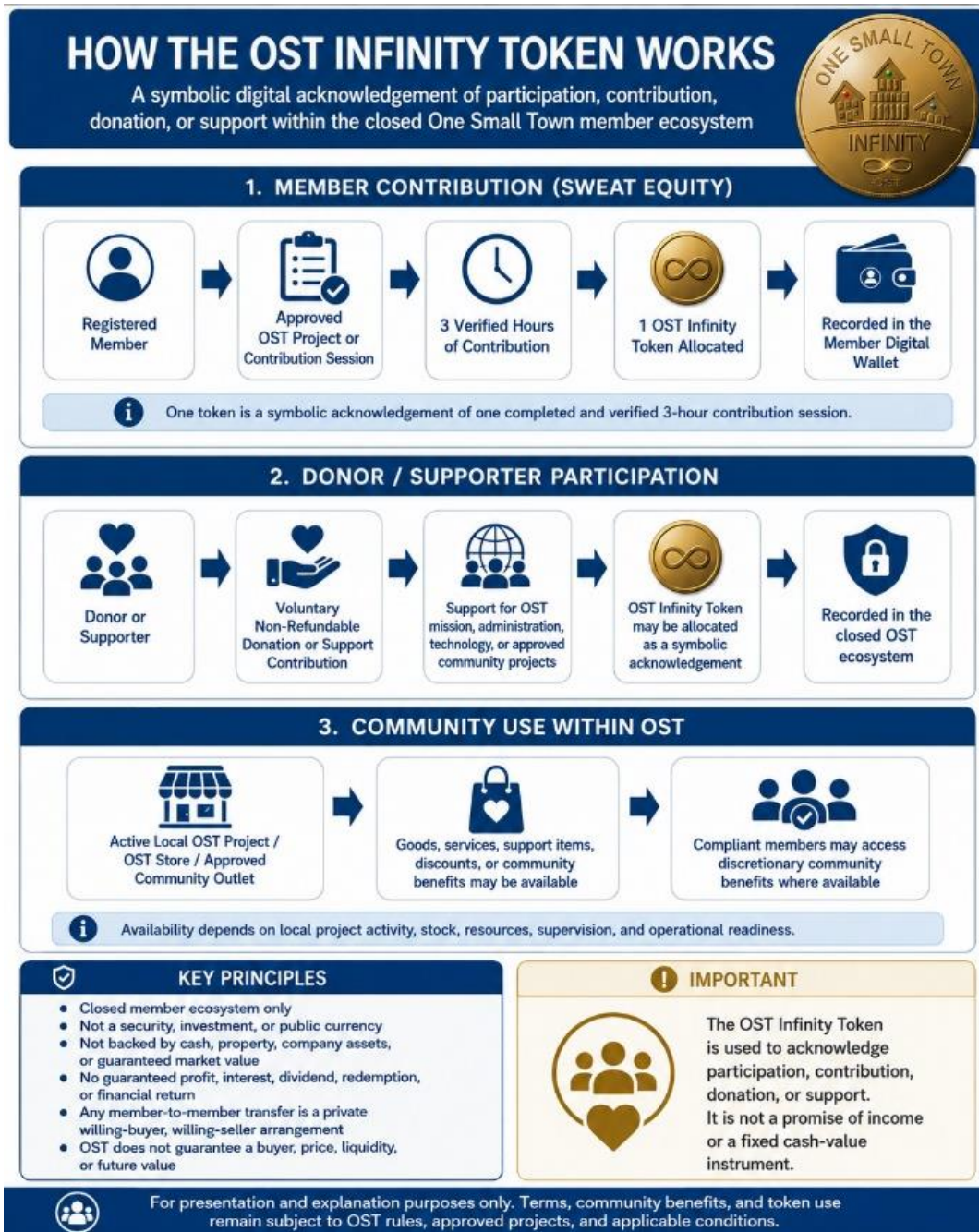
17. NO BONUS INTEREST, STAKING, GUARANTEED VALUE, OR FINANCIAL RETURN

Any allocation remains subject to the applicable OST rules, project requirements, verification procedures, eligibility criteria, and allocation limits in force at the relevant time.
- 17.4 OST Infinity Tokens have no guaranteed monetary, redemption, resale, or exchange value. One Small Town does not represent, warrant, or guarantee:
- 17.4.1 that an OST Infinity Token will have or retain any value;
 - 17.4.2 that its value will increase;
 - 17.4.3 that any market, buyer, demand, or liquidity will exist;
 - 17.4.4 that it may be redeemed, repaid, or converted into cash, cryptocurrency, goods, services, or any other asset; or
 - 17.4.5 that any transfer or proposed transfer will be completed successfully.
- 17.5 Any community benefit that may become available through a local One Small Town initiative is discretionary, conditional, and not guaranteed. They are not designed or intended to function as securities, shares, debt instruments, investment products, financial products, legal tender, public currency, asset-backed tokens, or guaranteed stores of value.
- 18.2 One Small Town may, from time to time, publish or apply an internal donation acknowledgement reference for OST Infinity Tokens. This reference may be used solely for internal administrative, symbolic, recordkeeping, contribution tracking, supporter acknowledgement, and closed ecosystem participation purposes.

- 18.3 Any internal donation acknowledgement reference may consider factors such as the stage of development of the One Small Town initiative, donation history, member participation, platform administration requirements, project activity, community growth, operational needs, and other internal OST considerations. However, such reference is not a pricing algorithm, market valuation model, investment valuation, asset valuation, redemption formula, or promise of future value.

Any such indication is not set, approved, endorsed, guaranteed, supported, or maintained by One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST Platform Technologies, or any authorised OST structure.
- 18.9 One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, and their related parties do not guarantee demand, liquidity, price, resale value, successful transfer, future value, price appreciation, redemption, repayment, conversion into cash, conversion into cryptocurrency, exchange for goods or services, or any financial return.
- 18.10 No person should donate for, receive, hold, list, or transfer OST Infinity Tokens with any expectation of profit, income, dividends, interest, capital growth, liquidity, repayment, redemption, token value, future value, or financial return.

Where a verified member completes an approved three-hour Contribution Session, the OST Platform may automatically record and allocate one OST Infinity Token as a symbolic acknowledgement of that verified contribution, subject to the applicable OST Platform rules, project rules, verification requirements, and recordkeeping processes.

OST Infinity Tokens will also be allocated as symbolic acknowledgements of voluntary donations, support contributions, registration participation, or other approved forms of support, where permitted by the applicable OST rules.

The allocation of OST Infinity Tokens is intended to support Contributionism, participation records, donor acknowledgements, project administration, community activity tracking, and closed ecosystem recordkeeping. As members continue to contribute in approved ways, additional OST Infinity Tokens may be recorded and allocated to acknowledge those contributions.

OST Infinity Tokens are not securities, shares, debt instruments, investment products, financial products, public currency, legal tender, asset-backed tokens, or guaranteed stores of value.

Any allocation, recording, correction, suspension, cancellation, recycling, or administration of OST Infinity Tokens is for symbolic, administrative, participation, contribution, donation, support, and recordkeeping purposes only.

No allocation or administration of OST Infinity Tokens creates any entitlement to cash, cryptocurrency, repayment, redemption, profit, dividends, interest, income, goods, services, discounts, liquidity, future value, or any guaranteed benefit or financial return.

OST Infinity Tokens are not allocated or administered for public trading, speculation, investment return, market pricing, liquidity, resale value, scarcity, or financial gain.

The OST Platform is intended to support the administration, coordination, recordkeeping, communication, participation tracking, project management, contribution records, donation acknowledgements, symbolic token records, Digital Wallet functionality, Membership Cards, OST Trading Stores, and approved closed-loop functionality of the One Small Town ecosystem.

22.1 The OST Platform Functionality may include, without limitation, the following functionality:

- 22.1.1 Member registration, onboarding, verification, and profile management.
- 22.1.2 Skills, expertise, qualification, experience, interest, and training records.
- 22.1.3 Project ideation, viability assessment, planning, management, task coordination, and contribution allocation.
- 22.1.4 Verification and recordkeeping of Contribution Sessions, completed tasks, project participation, training, mentoring, skills-sharing, and other approved contribution records.
- 22.1.5 Membership Card, digital member profile, QR code, and Digital Wallet functionality.
- 22.1.6 Recording of symbolic OST Infinity Token allocations, donation acknowledgements, participation acknowledgements, and other approved platform records.
- 22.1.7 Community project profiles, business profiles, participating business records, project needs, available resources, services, products, community needs, and local activity records.
- 22.1.8 Communication tools between members, Ambassadors, Agents, project supervisors, administrators, service providers, and approved role players, where available.
- 22.1.9 E-commerce, OST Trading Store, voucher, payment gateway, lawful donation, purchase, or store-related functionality, were approved and operational.
- 22.1.10 Smart contract, blockchain-like, automated recordkeeping, audit trail, reporting, compliance, and internal administration functionality.

- 22.1.11 Closed member-to-member listing facility or notice board functionality, where approved by OST Platform rules.
- 22.1.12 Voting, polling, consultation, decision-support, or governance-support functionality, were approved and applicable.
- 22.2 Platform Purpose and Limitations is designed to provide a secure and structured technology and administration layer for the One Small Town ecosystem. Its purpose is to improve transparency, accountability, communication, project coordination, contribution tracking, donation acknowledgement, local administration, and community participation.
 - 22.2.1 OST Infinity Tokens and any other approved OST participation tokens recorded on the OST Platform are symbolic digital acknowledgements of participation, contribution, donation, or support within the closed OST member ecosystem. They are not backed by cash, property, company assets, revenue, profit, commercial turnover, sweat equity, labour, store stock, vouchers, or any legally enforceable asset.
 - 22.2.2 The OST Platform does not operate as a bank, public crypto exchange, securities exchange, financial market, investment platform, payment institution, deposit-taking institution, brokerage service, crypto asset service provider, or financial advisory platform.
 - 22.2.3 The use of the OST Platform does not create any entitlement to cash, repayment, redemption, profit, dividends, interest, yield, investment return, token value, liquidity, goods, services, food baskets, discounts, or any guaranteed financial or community benefit.
- 22.3 Platform Access, Development and Rules are accessible from a smartphone, desktop computer, tablet, or other approved device, subject to system availability, user verification, connectivity, security requirements, and applicable platform rules.

Any such development will remain subject to evaluation, approval, available resources, appropriate agreements, operational viability, regulatory compliance, and responsible management. No announcement, proposal, discussion, or development should be interpreted as a guarantee that any project, technology, benefit, outcome, or milestone will be implemented or achieved.

Personal information will be processed in accordance with the Protection of Personal Information Act, 4 of 2013, commonly referred to as POPIA, and any other applicable privacy, data protection, consumer protection, electronic communications, and recordkeeping laws.

26.1 Personal information may be processed for lawful and legitimate purposes, including:

- 26.1.1 registering, onboarding, verifying, and managing members, donors, supporters, Ambassadors, Agents, project partners, service providers, and other approved role players.
- 26.1.2 creating and managing OST Platform accounts, member profiles, Digital Wallet records, Membership Cards, QR codes, participation records, and contribution records.
- 26.1.3 recording, verifying, and administering Contribution Sessions, project participation, compliance status, participation acknowledgements, and eligibility for discretionary community benefits where such benefits are available.

- 26.1.4 recording and acknowledging voluntary donations or support contributions.
- 26.1.5 communicating with members, donors, supporters, Ambassadors, Agents, project partners, service providers, and other approved role players.
- 26.1.6 supporting project management, community coordination, local administration, training, reporting, audit trails, platform security, fraud prevention, and operational integrity.
- 26.1.7 complying with applicable laws, regulatory requirements, lawful requests, accounting requirements, tax requirements, reporting obligations, dispute processes, and governance requirements.
- 26.1.8 protecting the rights, safety, security, property, and legitimate interests of members, donors, supporters, One Small Town, Ubuntu Planet NPC, OST Platform Technologies, authorised OST structures, project partners, service providers, and the wider OST ecosystem.

Personal information may be collected directly from the relevant person, through the OST Platform, through authorised Ambassadors, Agents, administrators, project supervisors, service providers, donation systems, communication channels, forms, website interactions, physical project processes, or other approved OST processes.

One Small Town will take reasonable steps to ensure that personal information processed through the OST ecosystem is accurate, complete, updated where necessary, and not misleading, having regard to the purpose for which it is processed. Members and other role players are responsible for keeping their information accurate and for notifying the relevant OST support channel, Ambassador, Agent, or administrator of any material change to their information.

Personal information may be shared with authorised OST structures, Ambassadors, Agents, administrators, project supervisors, technology service providers, payment service providers, professional advisers, auditors, compliance advisers, project partners, IVC-linked project structures, local OST initiatives, or other authorised role players where such sharing is reasonably required for the purposes described in this clause and subject to appropriate confidentiality, security, legal, and operational controls.

31 AML/KYC/FRAUD/SANCTIONS CONTROLS
